DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 2. What keeps your hope shackled by money? (Security, Fear, Safety, Etc.) Why?
- 3. Read Mark 12:41-44. Buck said, "God's not impressed with 0's, God's impressed with %'s." Do you agree or disagree? Why?
- 4. Read 1 Timothy 6:18. What are ways that we can be rich in good deeds when our daily schedules are so filled with activity?
- 5. Read Matthew 6:24. As a way to consider the principle Matthew introduces, look at (a.) and (b.) below. If a "1" is being mastered by your money and a "10" is mastering your money, how would you rate yourself? Why?
 - a. Mastered by Money: Live, Save, Give
 - b. Mastered by God: Give, Save, Live
- 6. Here's a challenge: For the next two months, choose a percentage of your income and give it away as soon as you get paid.
 - a. How does that challenge make you feel?
 - b. Do any tensions come up when you consider taking this challenge? What are thev?
 - c. What organization would you be excited to give to? Why?
